### **JANUARY - FEBRUARY**

#### MARCH - MAY

 Prepare for K Registration day. Check your school's website for details!

**Registration Requirements:** 

- Must be 5 years old on or before Sept. 1
- Birth certificate
- Health Examination: HRS Form 3040
- HRS Certificate of Immunization
- Three Proofs of Residency, such as a utility bill (electric, water, etc.), lease agreement, or deed or property tax assessment: auto registration, driver's license, voter registration card.)

## **MAY - AUGUST**

- Help your child develop independence by learning how to work belts, zippers, and buttons on clothing.
- Read books together about starting kindergarten.
- Practice opening lunch items such as fruit cups, storage containers, juice boxes, etc.
- Is your child's school offering a K Camp or meeting? Plan to attend!





#### TWO WEEKS BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS

- Start to establish an evening "going-to-bed" routine and a morning "getting-ready-forschool" routine with your child.
- Look for your school supply list from your school's social media page or website.

#### ONE WEEK BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS

- Plan to attend the Elementary Orientation Day event to learn more about your child's school, the kindergarten program, and to meet your child's teacher. (visit pasco.k12.fl.us for more information!)
- Make sure the school nurse is aware if your child has allergies or any medical needs.
- Make sure there is a clear plan for how your child is dropped off and picked up.

## FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

- · Allow plenty of time to get ready for school.
- If you are taking your child to school, leave early to allow time to find parking and be sure to follow the school guidelines for walking your child to class.
- Have fun and celebrate the first day of kindergarten with your child!

# THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

- Establish good attendance habits by making sure your child attends kindergarten each and every day on time.
- Set aside time after school each day to talk with your child about their day.
- Make backup plans to be sure your child can get to school on rainy days.
- Learn how you can become involved in your child's education!
